This process involves a surgeon moving a small go up through a flexible tube in the nostril, into the obstructed nose. The balloon is overpriced which pushes wide the blocked area. The balloon is then deflated and removed. Following this process there is a good possibility that the sinus drainage channel is widened as well as the nose can drain appropriately. When compared to the more traditional **endoscopic sinus surgery** which usually will involve muscle cutting and removal, this procedure causes much less trauma to be able to surrounding sinus and sinus tissue.
