Oftentimes however, sinusitis does not resolve completely with symptomatic treatment. When you see your doctor, he'd most likely prescribe a combination of drugs including decongestants and corticosteroids (probably as metered nasal sprays) as well as the right anti-microbial agent (such as antibiotics for bacteria or anti-fungal with regard to fungi) which would most likely be administered orally. Taking medications through the oral cavity or topically as a **nasal spray** are currently considered the most common treatment approaches however unfortunately, these treatment techniques may be affected by some factors that make them less effective; such as the time it takes for the medications to work as well as the possibility of developing systemic side effects. The active ingredients of drugs in nose sprays, on the other hand, may not be able to exert their particular intended outcomes in the event that they don't attain the distal portions of the nasal cavities plus more so, the sinus cavities which are located distally, because of overcrowding and inflammation.
